2015 has been a tumultuous year globally where wars,

The year 2015 was a milestone in many aspects for Kids.R.ok as we set out on completing our ambitious plan of building a new children's home in the Urladani village in Orissa with drinking water, and toilet and bathroom facilities. The project was initiated in 2014 when most of the planning and fund raising activities for the project were done. During our team visit early in January, we were able to ascertain the progress of the project and were satisfied with the construction efforts. The whole project was successfully completed by autumn and during our second visit to Orissa in late November, we were able to inaugurate and dedicate the newly built toilets and bathroom for the children.

Most important from our visits to Orissa was the bond we were able to form with the children living in the children's home and upon which we can build on and use to establish a better future for these lovely children.

The Chennai Slum Education Project was a new project Kids.R.ok wanted to initiate in 2015. Our team had visited the slum area called Saidapet in Chennai where we did a survey and met the children living with their families. The children's parents were mostly uneducated and the living environment wasn't conducive for these children to learn. We planned a pilot project with an evening tuition center, where we picked 15 children to attend and hired a dedicated teacher to teach these children with daily school work.

As we were about to launch the evening classes in November, the monsoon rains in Chennai burst forth for a month, which cumulated to 120cm rainfall in that month alone. The record rainfall of 50cm in a single day left Chennai deluged and needless to say the slum's houses which were near

the river bed were all under water. Kids.R.ok team members in Chennai led relief efforts where we launched a campaign to help the children living in the slums who lost everything. We were able to buy new clothes, shoes, school bags, notebooks, and stationery items, along with more clothes donated by donors. In total 250 children received help directly from Kids.R.ok and a big kudos to the team members who were also affected by the deluge, but stood up to help in times of distress despite their own inconveniences.

The year 2015 can be said as a year of evolution for Kids.R.ok where new team members joined the organization and are now filling up vital roles which will boost the working efficiency. The team coordination was tested during the floods where we came through with flying colors and the team communication across US, Sweden and India was bridged thanks to technology.

A special congratulations to select Kids.R.ok team members who got married this year; Jon Granlund, Ester & Jonathan Osbeck, Kadhambari Sridhar, and Sunjeet & Swetha. Kids.R.ok wishes them all the best on their new married life as they embark on a new innings of love and companionship.

In all things said and done, I want to thank the donors and friends of Kids.R.ok who supported

us from our launch almost three years back, believing in our vision of uplifting

the needy children and making an impact on the ground when duly required.

You share the success of these children with your kind help in their times of need.

What have we achieved in the year 2015?

GIFT OF WATER

Water is the essence of life! During our 2014 visit to the Orissa children's home, we discovered the drinking water facility for the children was very poor. The drinking water was light brownish in color and during the summers when water scarcity is high, many children were prone to fall ill from water borne diseases.

Kids.R.ok initiated the water project before we started the construction work. With the monsoon rains and recent cyclone Hudhud hampering the start of the construction efforts, we finally finished drilling the bore well. The water drilling was done to the depth of 240ft (73.15m). We also installed a hand pump and a motor pump along with connecting pipes to give the children access to fresh groundwater 24/7. After having finished drilling for ground water which gives the children's home their own water supply,

the Kids.R.ok team thought of providing a long term sustainable solution which not only benefits the children's health but also is eco-friendly and self-sufficient in terms of energy sustainability.

The Kids.R.ok team proceeded to give the children's home a useful gift – a water filter which works without electricity – the Lifestraw filter. Lifestraw's product, with its innovative water filter technology, gave us the possibility of combining the sustainability and quality requirements needed for the children's home in Orissa. Kids.R.ok was able to purchase the Lifestraw filter with the help of specific donor's gifts and ship it to Orissa during the recent visit to the children's home.

Needless to say, the children were overjoyed to have a facility which provided them access to clean drinking water. When we told them the water was ready to be drunk from the water filter, the children ran to get themselves a cup to drink clean filtered water. The four taps provided in the water filter gave access to multiple children at the same time rather than forming a long single queue.





FIRST TOILET IN URLADANI VILLAGE

ORISSA CHILDREN'S HOME

In our first visit to the children's home, our team was taken aback at the sight of the living condition for the children and to make it worse, the children did not have proper sanitary facilities and had to use the wilderness near the riverside during early mornings.

In India, 60% of the rural population still uses the outdoors to relieve themselves in the absence of toilets. This is a problem for women and girls who usually go out in the dark at night, leading to safety issues. This movement to build toilets incidentally was echoed even by India's national leaders "Build toilets first, temples later" – Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi. Kids.R.ok took the challenge and appealed to our supporters to help us raise funds to start construction of sanitary facilities, and people responded positively to our campaign.



In the summer of 2014, Kids.R.ok started planning construction for toilets and bathrooms for the children's home in Orissa. We were given an estimate for the toilet construction based on the survey by a Government Civil Engineer.

The Engineer visited the site where the current children's home is located and did an extensive survey. Based on his findings, he sent us an attested report which stipulated the cost of

each material needed and the cost for construction. The findings of the report were then cross verified by a Senior Civil Engineer in Chennai by our Kids.R.ok Indian team. The Civil Engineer gave us the confirmation that all the estimates were right and that we could proceed on beginning our construction work.

Kids.R.ok consulted with an independent architect who has considerable experience in building toilets in rural India, to give us a concept layout of how we could build the new children's home toilet and bathroom. After much iteration, we were able to get the right design to have optimal construction strength and be cost efficient. The planning process took us three to four months as we felt it was important for us to do our first construction project right. In addition, we had to raise funds to achieve our construction cost target. We also included a separate toilet to be handicap accessible, so in future, if there is any handicapped child, he or she would be able to use the toilet without any difficulty.

We began the construction during winter, as it was difficult to find labourers to come to this village to work, as the day labourers usually go to towns and cities since they earn higher day wages. The

construction work for the toilet also included building a septic tank along with an overhead tank to store water.

Kids.R.ok dedicated the newly constructed toilets & bathroom during our visit to Orissa on 28th November 2015. This is officially the first 'pukkah' constructed toilet in the whole village with water and septic tank facility.

This time our board trustee, Mr. N. Ashok Kumar, a retired 'Chief Auditor' for a national bank in India, accompanied the visit and was the chief guest for dedication. We had a short thanksgiving prayer and song in Oriya, the local language of the people. The caretaker of the children's home Mr. S.K Nayak and his wife along with the children and local tribal women from the village were present.

The children were very grateful to have this facility provided, especially girls who find it difficult to go outside in the rain or at night. Thank you to donors for making a difference in the lives of these children. This will also serve the larger community of women who live in the area to use the facility for their safe benefit and hygiene as well.




PEN MIGHTIER THAN A SIVORD

We all remember the first day we go to school; our parents buy us a school bag and fill it up with school books. Then we receive a pouch called a pencil box with pencils, erasers, rulers etc. All these things make us realize we are ready to go to school.

For the children's home visit in 2015, the Kids.R.ok team decided to buy pencil boxes and filled them up with new sets of pens, pencils, rulers, erasers and pencil sharpeners. We thought it was a modest gift for the children. In comparison, last time we gave the children in Orissa lots of sports equipment and clothes, which any child in the world would love to receive as a gift. But since our focus is education, playtime was over and it was now time to get serious. And what better way than give the children school stationery items!

The children each received a pencil box set from the Kids.R.ok team. We were informed by the caretaker that the children had never owned a pencil box set before. We were surprised but also glad to see the children receiving and using their brand new pencil box set for the first time in their lives. The children kept their pencil box set neatly wrapped in their cover and held on to it until we asked them to use it. In the end our modest gift was certainly pragmatic and purposeful.



IN-HOUSE LIBRARY

Books are a key source of knowledge impartation. We thought of improving English proficiency for the children as they get to practice very little English outside the school environment. What better way to widen a child's imagination and vocabulary by making them interested in reading books. The Kids.R.ok team bought story books and primary level grammar books from the Chennai book fair 2015. We also had some books donated from New York, which we duly packed in our gift bags. At Orissa, the children were gifted these books and we educated them on why they should read books and how valuable it will be for their knowledge and growth in learning English. Now it is time to read...



TO CHILDREN WITH LOVE

Prior our visit to the children's home, the donors and supporters of Kids.R.ok asked us to carry their love and well wishes to the children in Orissa. To manifest the love that was bestowed upon us to carry, the Kids.R.ok team decided to personally create a gift that we felt would convey the feeling to give these cute children. Fabrica helped us in creating this gift a collection of portraits of the individual kids that we took in our 2014 visit. We had also bought 70 pencil box sets and English educational books to take along with us.

Fabrica did a fine job of creating the above gift. We wrapped it up with cloth and cardboard in order to transport it safely over the 1300 km long and hard journey by train and car.

When we arrived at the children's home, we told them that we had a surprise gift. We called two kids to come forward to and open the gift in front of the children. All the children looked on in anticipation and when they saw the portraits of themselves, they became so elated. The children had never before seen a photo of themselves and they broke in rapturous applause with bright smiles. The children wanted to hang the portrait in the main hall, so they could look at it every day.

The caretaker was even more touched, and he couldn't take his eyes off the children's portrait. He was teary eyed and was lost for a moment in his thoughts. For a man who has spent so many years raising the children, he thanked us for the heartfelt gift. Your love and generous support has touched these wonderful kids in a significant way. Thank you for giving us the privilege to carry your heartfelt love and bless these children.



ORISSA CHILDREN'S HOME VISIT 2015

Part - I: INTERACTIONS WITH CHILDREN

Our visit to Orissa children's home was in much anticipation to meet the children again. We planned this trip in such a way that we could use our time to interact with the children and establish a connection with them. This was something our team missed in our 2014 visit and we didn't want a repeat of that. It also helped that we were three persons travelling this time rather than two, which gave us more leeway to plan and have more activities with the children.

During our two day long journey by train and car, Roy and Sunjeet were trying to recall the names of all the 60 children by looking at their profile photos. I was surprised that they could remember quite a lot of names and to their credit these guys do have a pretty sharp memory.

For me on my first trip to Orissa children's home, I was not stressed that I couldn't remember more than five or seven names out of sixty just by looking at their photos. My eagerness was for the chance to meet these lovely kids face to face, and travelling more than 7,000 km to India was primarily for this objective.

Finally we arrived to the children's home! The view has changed from our last visit due to the new construction efforts and the children were waiting for us in a line behind the new steel gate. Brother SK Nayak and his wife welcomed us with a shawl gift and washing of the feet. We were also greeted by the other assistant care takers. Then the children with three flowers garlanded us and touched our feet to receive our blessings (a traditional Indian custom).

The children then greeted us with an Oriyan welcome song with a loud voices which reverberated through the newly constructed hall. Brother SK Nayak introduced me to the

children who gave an apprehensive hello, and when brother SK Nayak asked the children whether they remembered brother Sunjeet and brother Roy, the children broke into a smile and all shook their head vigorously saying a big Oriyan 'Haa' (YES!)

I then spoke to the children conveying the love and well wishes of all Kids.R.ok donors. I wanted the children to know that they are loved and we are there to help them fulfil their dreams for their future. During our following interactions with the children, I noticed that these kids were so well behaved, listening to our words, seeing our actions and waiting for their turn to speak back. The credit should go to the caretaker for upbringing these kids with good morals and with the correct etiquette.

The children always responded with a smile even if we could not directly communicate with them. We always needed Brother SK Nayak to translate our English queries into Oriyan, the older children tried to use English words to say thank you and hi, while the tiny ones were just too shy or busy running around. The girls were braver asking us to teach them some songs and dance. We looked at each other and after much hesitation we agreed to teach them a simple English children's song. At least we didn't have to dance, so we thought. Roy, whose talent in singing needs no introduction, taught them a three stanza song (which he improvised into a four stanza song), and the children picked it up quickly in their first attempt (see our youtube video). It just showed their eagerness to learn something new, learn it quickly, and do it well.

We had planned some games to make it fun and divided the children into 5 groups. This was to teach them about team work and think and develop their English communication skills to respond with their answers in English. Again it was not a problem to conduct games with so many children as they were all well mannered. The children really immersed themselves into the games, obeying the rules and having fun nonetheless.

We were very well hosted by brother SK Nayak during our stay, eating tasty origan spicy foods and the best part, we got our wish to spend time with children. But the time to leave the children came soon and we packed our bags and got into the car. We saw the children coming out to wave goodbye to us and we waved back, promising to come back next year. We left behind Urladani village with some satisfaction but still a hole in our hearts knowing that we are just beginning to make a difference into the lives of these beautiful children.



ORISSA CHILDREN'S HOME VISIT 2015

Part - II GOTTA LOVE THEIR SMILE

I planned another visit to Orissa to see the finished construction project of the children's home and inaugurate the finished construction of toilets and bathrooms. Not more than ten months ago, when I visited the children in Orissa, the kids were bit apprehensive in their interactions. It might have been the language barrier or just meeting someone for the first time, which to be honest, makes us all be on our guard regardless. So this time around, I wanted the barrier to be broken and make a connection with the kids.

We played lot of games which involved English word building and vocabulary. I asked the kids to share with me their talents and in respect also demonstrate their abilities to everyone. Some danced, some sang, some showed their acrobatic skills etc.

I then took them outside away from the prying eyes of the elders, so the kids could feel free to express their emotions and actions. We played some team games together and the kids really



loved it. The children during my stay became very friendly and we ran around the home making jokes and taking some selfies.

Time does fly by when you are having a good time and soon it was time to say goodbye to the kids. I could see the disappointment in their faces when I told them I am leaving but I reassured them that I and my team members will be back soon. The sun was setting across the horizon when the thought crossed my mind: 'mission accomplished':)

CHENNAI SLUM PROJECT NEW PROJECT



Social media today plays a vital role in communication in so much that even governments have been toppled by a #tweet. One such instance is a story of a boy living in the streets of Delhi, who diligently did his daily home work while at the same time working to earn few coins to buy his stationery items for school work. Thousands passed by this little boy without much notice or concern until when a passer-by took his photo and posted it on his facebook wall. The 13-year-old Harendra Singh became an instant hit on social media. Soon he received help from the state to fund his education till college.

It is not uncommon in big cities. Children living in the slum areas have no access to basic stationery items, tutorial help or just a quiet place where they can do their homework. Kids.R.ok is now looking to open an education project in the slum areas of Chennai. We have identified two potential places to start our project and visited to meet the children living in that locality.



Walking through the narrow streets and going to small houses under the main city bridge, the daylight turns into darkness and one must be careful on what you are going to step on to. The children were assembled by a local person who grew up in the slums and is now an active member in the nearby church reaching out to help the slum dwelling children. He told me about his struggles growing up in the slums where the easy way to thrive is by joining gang members or do crime. In most household, it is the women who are raising the children by doing cleaning work at residential homes or worse, by prostitution.

The children themselves are sweet but lack moral guidance. We need to show that they can become good citizens in the future and show our love to them by carrying out our vision of 'education first'!

DELUGE IN CHENNAI (INDIA)

Nature's fury brings everyone to its knees, both the rich and the poor- though it seems the poor always seem to take the brunt of her wrath. The sad news is the loss of more than 400 people and thousands of homes gone asunder in the deluge. Incessant monsoon rains caused the metropolitan city of Chennai to become an 'island' flooded by river waters flowing out of lakes and reservoirs.

The northeast monsoon has been particularly vigorous over southern India and more so in Tamil Nadu state, of which Chennai is the capital. Schools, colleges, and factories have been shut for almost a month, exams postponed and power supply suspended in most parts of the city. Airports, train stations and bus transportation were all shut down as only boats became the viable option to travel.

On a personal note, some of Kids.R.ok team members had to flee from their homes to hotels, others were stuck inside their homes as the flood water outside rose to about 6ft (almost 2 meters) leaving them cut off from roads to escape the deluge. Some were fortunate that the waters were just about knee level. Many had to live without electricity and running water supply which made life very difficult.

Those following Kids.R.ok know about our plans to start the evening education project in Saidapet slum. We were about to launch it this November but the incessant rains postponed our launch. We have not forgotten the children we met this February in their slum homes with whom we spent time singing songs and sharing stories. The whole slum area's hut houses are under river water now and the families living there have lost all their belongings. We want to return there and help these children regain all that they have lost.



RELIEF EFFORTS







Sweden was able to manage by the contribution of committed donors and few events which helped in raising project money needed for the year 2015.


TARGET FOR 2015 ACHIEVED:

Kids.R.ok had set a goal of \$15000 USD / 125000 SEK to finance the projects for the year 2015. Kids.R.ok raised 126280,08 SEK approx equivalent to \$14911,87 USD in currency conversion.



Kids.R.ok was able to save major project costs from the children's home construction. The project costs were shared between 'AWAZ' the children's home founder's organization in Orissa. The fact that the Chennai slum education project was postponed due to rains and the teacher training program not taking off as scheduled, kids.R.ok got a substantial cash reserve going into 2016. We will kick start these projects and the reserved funds will be suitably used to help children in their education pursuit in Chennai and Orissa respectively.

Fika is a central concept in Swedish culture. Fika means having something small to eat, often together with a cup of coffee or tea. While looking for some way to raise funds at my University, I got inspired by the bake sale the Kids.R.ok team in New York hosted some months ago. If a bake sale was a success in the US, having a bake sale in this fika-craving country should be even easier.

So said and done, I started spreading my idea among my friends to see if anyone was willing to help me out. The Christian Student Organization signed up as soon as they



heard about it and also expressed an interest in helping with more events like this. Friends, my small group, someone's classmate – a lot of people came together and baked for us.

In the beginning of December we put up a little stall outside the University Library, selling our fika. ON THE LOOKOUT FOR

TEACHERS:

Kids.R.ok is searching for full time teachers from India who can speak the local language and communicate in English. Since the government schools don't teach English, and the only English medium school in that locality has classes up to 2nd grade. We think it would be beneficial for the children to grow up having knowledge acquired in English. Our plan is to hire a teacher who can stay at the village or at the nearest town, to come to the children's home and spend time with them every day for a couple of hours teaching them English.

3 reasons why we consider education in English an important criteria:

- 1. English is an international language the whole world communicates with. Throughout the world, when people from different countries and ethnicities come together they commonly use English to communicate.
- 2. English is the language used in the professional and business world. This gives the children bilingual skills and more chance for university education and professional employment.
- 3. English language gives the children access to information learning available through the internet and wider reach through social networks.

While learning English can be challenging and time consuming, it is still considered an easy language to adapt. We can see that it is also very valuable to learn and creates many opportunities for the children's future.


